Why Do Urban Kids Need Our Help?

- Denver currently has a 56% "On-Time" graduation rate
- 92% of Action Youth students in Denver Public Schools are on the free and reduced lunch program, making them six times as likely to drop out of school. **
- According to the Denver Police, Denver has 200 gangs with 14,000 members, which has doubled over a decade.
- In 2007, homicide was the 2nd leading cause of death for urban students ages 10 to 24 years old.
- 1 in 5 Children are born to teen mothers in Action Youth communities **
- 46% of people over the age of 25 in Action Youth communities have less than a 12th grade education **
- Only 55% of graduating students enroll in college after High School with only 21% of those enrolled graduate ****

Five Ways Action Youth Meets the Need

- 1. Providing close relationships with caring adults to students from 6th grade through college.
 - <u>Note</u>: Close relationships with at least one caring adult foster a sense of belonging, which is an essential ingredient of successful youth development (Bentro et al., 1990; Eccles Ph.D. & Gootman MA, 2002; Pollack Ph.D., 2004).
- 2. In-school class elective incorporated as the primary component for developing "Student Leaders"
- 3. Action Youth develops "Student Leaders" by focusing on:
 - Healthy Life Choices Growing emotional, mental, physical, & spiritual capacity
 - <u>Academic Excellence</u> Developing enthusiasm to learn with rigor and relevance
 - <u>Leading to Serve</u>: Serving peers, school, and community to be a positive change
- 4. High school students become leaders and role models to incoming freshman and middle school students.
- 5. Year-round impact on students through in-school and summer programming

Measurable Success

- 100% of Action Youth students participate in Service Learning Projects
- 90% of Action Youth seniors graduate from high school
- 87% of Action Youth graduates are currently enrolled in college
- Each graduate saves the economy \$2 million over his or her lifetime.*
 - *Based on economic and tax revenue savings through welfare and prison costs, according to the Journal of Criminology

More ACTION YOUTH Facts

- ACTION YOUTH partners with two DPS feeder schools (Kepner Middle & Lincoln High School)
- Over 530 students served by ACTION YOUTH programs in 2013-2014 school year
- In-School Assembly Awareness Campaigns impacted over 950 students
